THE ALL-SEEING EYES OF THE LORD

"The Doom of Pride" Obadiah 1:1-4

Introduction: The book of Obadiah is the shortest in the Old Testament; It prophesies a judgment upon Edom for its treatment of Jerusalem.

I. (v. 1) GOD'S VISION OF EDOM.

- 1. Two nations are here: Edom, the descendants of Esau (a Godrejector) and Jacob, his twin (the God-recipients).
- 2. Esau had no spiritual discernment but lived by his fleshly desires.
- 3. Esau, the oldest, sold his birthright for a bowl of soup (Gal. 5:17).
- 4. The nation of Edom followed the fleshly example of Esau.

II. (v. 2) GOD'S VENGEANCE AGAINST EDOM.

- 1. God's vengeance was sparked against Edom's pride.
 - A. Pride always closes the channel of God's blessings.
 - B. James 4:6
- 2. God's all-seeing eyes always find pride and resists it.
- A. *Proverbs 6:16-19 -* Pride is on God's hate list.
- B. Pride caused war in heaven before the creation of earth (Ezekiel 28:13-19; Isaiah 14:12-17; Revelation 12:7-9).
- 3. God's wrath is incurred over pride unless it's broken by repentance.

III. (v. 3) GOD SEES THE VICE IN EDOM.

- 1. God sees the prideful vice in Edom just as He saw it in King Nebuchadnezzar, which drove him insane.
 - A. Daniel 4:30-37 His sin, insanity, judgment, and return.
 - B. Pride is saying in one's heart, "I can live my life without God."
- 2. What happens when pride gets a foothold in our hearts?
 - A. We are deceived about our relationship with God, our dependency upon God, our self-sufficiency instead of God dependency, and about our eternity with God.
 - B. We develop the attitude of our being indestructible. (Proverbs 8:13 & I John 2:16)
- 3. The Edomites had convinced themselves that they didn't need God.

IV. (v. 4) GOD'S VICTORY OVER EDOM.

- 1. The Edomites resolved to live with the eagles.
- 2. The Edomites refused to acknowledge their evil.
- 3. The Edomites were finally conquered by David, then by Solomon.
