THE COST OF A PRAYING CHURCH

Acts 4:31, Luke 19:46

Introduction:

I heard someone say, "It doesn't cost anything to be a praying church." God rang that statement in my heart, and I have given this much thought. Financially, the outlay for a praying church is cheaper than any other spiritual ministry of the church; however, God has promised that our failure to be a praying church will be the most costly venture the church has ever encountered. There are two costs God wants us to realize.

I. THERE IS A PERSONAL COST.

- It will cost us the rearranging of priorities in our lives (Matt. 6:33; Luke 18:1).
- 2. It will cost us the denunciation of pride from our lives (James 4:10).

II. THERE WILL BE A COLLECTIVE COST.

- 1. Our failure to pray will cost souls going to hell.
 - A. Charles Spurgeon's Furnace Room.
 - B. Matthew 17:14-21 Jesus told us the hard cases are won by faith, prayer, and fasting.
- 2. Our failure to pray will cost Christians yielding to temptation and back-sliding.
 - A. The model prayer says, "And lead us not into temptation, but deliver us from evil."
 - B. By prayer and God's Word, Jesus was victorious over temptation.
 - 1) Prayer is the defensive weapon, and the Bible is the offensive weapon for the Christian.
 - 2) Prayer gives inward strength, and the Bible makes the outward assault when necessary.
- 3. Failure to pray will cost the church real revival.
- 4. Failure to pray will cause death to some who would have lived longer (James 5:15; II Kings 20:1-11 -Hezekiah)
- 5. Failure to pray will cost the success of our Christian world mission (James 4:2).

Conclusion: "My house shall be called a house of prayer."
