SEASONS

THE SEASON OF ORDINARY TIME | *January 6th – March 1st*

In the church calendar, we have what is called “ordinary time”. This is for those times of the year where we are not observing any particular season or feast day. During ordinary time, we may center our worship and lives around varying topics from Scripture.

DAYS

TRANSFIGURATION | *February 27th*

Transfiguration Sunday is an important day on the church calendar, for it is the day in which we remember the special revelation of Christ’s divine glory to His disciples upon what we now know as the Mount of Transfiguration. In this moment, it was shown to the disciples that our Lord Jesus Christ was no mere man, but the very Son of God, whose glory was veiled by His flesh.

COLORS

GREEN

During ordinary time, the color green is used. Green is used to remind us of the growth of new spiritual life, similar to the green growth of plants and vegetation. It is a time for us to take what we have learned of Christ and put it into action.

WHITE

White is only used once for this month, and it is used on Transfiguration Sunday, to mark the importance of the day itself.
